### Pennsylvania Route 6 Heritage Community:

- On Jan. 13, 2005, Pennsylvania Governor Edward G. Rendell designated a 400-mile corridor stretching through 11 northern counties as the Pennsylvania Route 6 Heritage Corridor. The designated area became the state's 12th heritage park. The governor encourages state residents and visitors to travel along what National Geographic has called "one of America's most scenic drives."
- The Revitalization of Youngsville strategy has involved cooperation and collaboration between the Borough, Youngsville Businesses, and the people of ROY to create a long-range plan. We have build *partnerships* with the Warren County Planner, Commissioners, Vacation Bureau, the State Legislators, The Community Foundation, Whirley Industries, Blair Corp, United Refining, PNC Bank, Northwest Savings Bank, DCED, DCNR, EOC, E.G. & G, the PA Wilds, the Route 6 Heritage Corp and more.
- Youngsville's plan is to enhance natural, cultural, scenic, recreational, and historical resources by incorporating and featuring its assets into the Revitalization projects. Having Route 6, the forest, and Brokenstraw Creek run through the community is a bonus for sight seeing, fishing, rafting, hiking, and biking
- Rick Truscello from the EADS Corp. hired by the Pennsylvania Rt.6 Heritage Cooperation will summarize findings from our previous public meetings & focus groups. He will offer recommendations for the future our community.
